

How to be a Distinguished Military Graduate (DMG) at Hampton University

- **Academic**
 - Earn a Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) of 3.3 or higher by the end of your junior year.

- **Leadership**
 - **Campus Performance:** While on campus you must display the abilities to be ranked by the Professor of Military Science (PMS) in the top 10% of your class.
 - Your on campus Cadet Evaluation Report (CER) must reflect your performance. Your goal is quality performance as indicated by training standards set forth. This performance will indicate whether or not you will be ranked in the top 10% of your class.
 - Participate in additional training and extracurricular activities. These include Airborne School, Air Assault School, Mountain Warfare School, Cadet Practical Field Training (CPFT), Cadet Troop Lead Training (CTLT), and the Drill Cadet Leadership Training (DCLT) programs. There are also opportunities for internships and special programs.
 - Involve yourself in as many of the following activities as possible: Color Guard, Drill Team, Ranger Challenge, ROTC Recruiter, USAR/NG/SMP, Community Service, Student Government, Band Member, Debate Team, Elected Official of an Organization, Leader of organization/team (president/captain), Resident Advisor, Peer Educator/Tutor, Full-time job, Part-time job.
 - APFT: Demonstrate continuous improvement culminating with a score of 285 or higher by your MS III year.
 - Embody the 7 Army Values and the Warrior Ethos.
 - Earn a high ranking from the PMS by distinguishing yourself.

 - **Warrior Forge Performance:** While at Warrior Forge you will have six evaluated leadership positions. There are two Garrison opportunities, two Squad STX opportunities, one FLRC and one Patrol STX opportunity. You need to earn at least 3 overall excellences (“E”) in these graded positions.
 - Your Leader attributes, skills and actions are also evaluated. These 16 dimensions are important components in the Leadership Development Process (LDP) as well as your graded leadership positions. You need to earn at least 9 out of 16 “E”’s in these dimensions.
 - Land Navigation: First time “GO” in both written and Day/Night practical examination.
 - Work well with your assigned squad and platoon. This will help your peer evaluations. If you want to do well, you must not keep to yourself or become a spotlight Cadet.

- APFT: Score a 285 or more in order to improve your ranking on the Order of Merit List (OML) and make a good initial impression
- BRM: Fire 23 or higher to be considered a “GO”.
- CWST: To pass this event achieve a “GO” in all 3 events.
- RECONDO: Meet all the standards of this qualification and earn the badge. See below.
- Platoon Top 5: Distinguish yourself amongst your peers to earn this honor. This can be done by your demonstrated leadership skills and camp performance.
- Warrior Forge CER: Your performance during WF will decide on your evaluation.

RECONDO CRITERIA

APFT

270 or above with 90 pts in each event without retest

LAND NAV

Score 80% or above in each phase (16/20 written, 40/50 day, 24/30 night) without retest

BRM

Qualify (score of 23 or higher)

CONFIDENCE TRAINING EVENTS

Pass all Confidence Training tasks to prescribed standards.

NO WAIVERS ON ANY EVENTS

Earn “Satisfactory” or above rating in 16 leadership dimensions and 7 Army Values
Pass Warrior Forge without non-medical waiver.

SITUATIONAL TACTICAL EXERCISE (STX)

Pass both Squad STX evaluations with a rating of “Satisfactory” or higher.

ITT ASSAULT COURSE

Successfully complete the ITT Assault Course.

HAND GRENADE ASSAULT

Successfully complete the Hand Grenade Assault Course.

1ST AID ASSAULT COURSE

Successfully complete the 1st Aid Assault Course.

WATER SAFETY

Successfully complete all water safety tasks (15-meter Swim, 3-meter drop, Equipment Removal).
